He successfully completed his first term online this summer, and James and I sent him on his way to campus life yesterday. I will likely join him next year, as James and I are staying in Fairhope this year for James's senior year at Fairhope High School. Some of you knew Stephen before I did, as he first

visited St. James when he moved to Fairhope in 2009. Upon graduation, Stephen will be ordained in our diocese, where we hope to continue to serve unless called elsewhere. # SUNG COMPLINE September 20 8 pm, Online


Listen. Rest. Worship.

## Family Promise

For years, St. James faithfully and strongly supported Family Promise, whose mission is to transform the lives of families who experience



homelessness. Because of the pandemic, we and other area churches are unable to host Family Promise on our sites. This fall, Family Promise was scheduled to stay at St. James in mid-September.

"During this time, the families are able to stay in the Family Promise home but are not provided any other services," explains St. James Family Promise coordinator Nickie Olson.
