

Nelson and their two children – Emily age 26 and Andrew age 22.



After graduating Foley High School, Chris received a B.S. in Biology from the University of the South in Sewanee, TN. During a leave of absence from Sewanee, he attended the Fall Undergraduate Marine Sciences Program at Duke University Marine Lab at Beaufort, NC. He later received his M.S. in Marine Environmental Sciences from the

State University of New York at Stony Brook.

While completing his Masters thesis Chris was a Congressional Sea Grant Fellow in Washington, DC, serving as a legislative assistant for Senator Ted Stevens. After his fellowship he worked for the National Fisheries Institute in Washington as a project coordinator.

He has been at Bon Secour Fisheries since 1989 and is now a Vice President working with his two brothers, John Andrew and David, and father John Ray. His most immediate area of responsibility is oyster product manager. This involves oyster procurement, processing and sales.
