A native of Forsyth, Georgia, Mary Katherine received her Bachelor of Music degree in Organ Performance from Valdosta State University with post graduate studies in voice, opera, and choral conducting at Clayton College and State University in Morrow, Georgia, and the University of Alabama in Tuscaloosa.

Mary Katherine, a talented and accomplished musician, taught piano and voice privately for over 20 years, and has judged numerous piano, vocal, and choral competitions. She also served on the Board of Directors for the Alabama Chapter of the American

Choral Director's Association between 2014 and 2019.

Mary Katherine is no stranger to Fairhope, having served as Director of Music for both Fairhope United Methodist and Trinity Presbyterian churches. She has spent the past two years teaching chorus full time at St. Michael Catholic High School. Prior to moving to the Eastern Shore, she served as Director of Music at Vernon United Methodist Church in Vernon, Alabama and St. Mark United Methodist Church in Northport, Alabama.

In addition to being an outstanding musician and teacher, she excels as a conductor and will begin her 10th season as the Artistic Director of the Eastern Shore Choral Society this fall. The ESCS is a non-

auditioned community chorus made up of individuals with varying degrees of musical skill from high school age to the young at heart. In recent years, the ESCS has been invited to sing with other choruses, such as the Mobile Symphony Orchestra. They also performed at Carnegie Hall in New York City.

Mary Katherine is excited to return to full time music ministry. She looks forward to serving alongside Helen Rodgers at St. James and teaching music to the students at the St. James Episcopal School. Mary Katherine has been a resident of Fairhope since 2005. She and her husband Rodney have one daughter, Emily, who will be a high school senior this fall.
