Each year in Lent, we are invited to the observance of a Holy Lent. Through a process of selfexamination, repentance, prayer, fasting, self-denial, and scriptural reflection, we are encouraged to walk more closely with God. We will all participate in little ways. Some will give things up for the season, while others will take things on. Some will look forward to each Sunday seeing those as "six mini-Easters" or "free-to-cheat" days. Others will be very strict with their disciplines surmising that cheat days are only for those who are weak of heart, mind or faith. Some will make it all the way through the forty days and feel a sense of accomplishment. Others will fail quickly and struggle to get back on track. All of this and even none of it is the Episcopal way. You see, Lent is our one excuse each year to be better. We can use the time to better ourselves, working to become better people, better Episcopalians, better Christians, and somehow get closer to God. Please give yourself an opportunity to give Lenten disciplines a whirl.

If you're reading this and you still are undecided on what to do, I can offer a couple of suggestions. One

discipline to try revolves around Wednesdays. I'm suggesting that perhaps we let Wednesdays be a part of our Lenten discipline by using it as a second day of the week for time with God. Presiding Bishop Curry has invited all Episcopalians to dedicate Wednesdays to prayer, fasting, and devotion to God as a way of drawing us together as a people. I know fasting is not for everyone, but perhaps instead you could begin each Wednesday by coming out to worship at 7 am. There is a light breakfast immediately following the 35 minute service for those who are hungry, or you could skip the meal for those of you desiring to fast one day a week. If you need a boost in your Wednesday, or for those who just start a little later, there is also a 10 am service of Healing and Eucharist in the Chapel. At 5:30 pm you could wind down your day by joining us for a light soup and salad dinner, and then listen to one of our selected speakers each week. The topic this year is seeing God with 2020 vision, and our speakers have been encouraged to tell us stories about their faith walk, how they've seen God along the way, and how they believe they are connecting with God here in 2020. We'll prayerfully close out each Wednesday evening with Compline, which are prayers for the close of the day.

Another option you might want to try during this season is making sure you come to church each Sunday. What could be a better way of getting closer to God than spending time in prayer and thanksgiving with your community of faith. The old adage says that habits are formed through repetition. If you want to be closer to God, you need to be intentional about repeating the practice of prayer and worship. Be mindful of how you pray to God. Often the words used to express our feelings can revive or refresh the relationships we have with our Lord. Each Sunday in Lent offers opportunities to reflect on how we pray because we will be using the penitential rite and a different form of the Lord's Prayer. Hopefully the subtle changes will provide you with beautiful new interpretations of our rich and wonderful traditions.

Whatever you may decide, I encourage you to spend this season of Lent being better at becoming the individual God already knows you to be. Pray frequently, smile bigger, laugh longer, rest easier, love stronger, and make God smile with all that you do.

Ministry Scheduler Pro Tips



TIP #1: When the schedule is generated, go to the Ministry Scheduler Pro Website and add all of the dates and times you are scheduled to serve to either your paper calendar or the calendar on your phone—however you currently keep the

rest of your life organized. The next schedule will be generated in mid-May for June, July, and August. You will receive a reminder email to put in your "can't serve dates" before the schedule is generated and you will receive an email letting you know that the schedule has been finalized. You can log into the system at any time and check to see if you are scheduled. If you will put all of your dates on your own calendar, you won't have to worry if you are have trouble with getting your reminder emails.

TIP #2: Enter your **CAN'T SERVE DATES** before the cut off date to avoid being scheduled when you are not available. One click and you can enter a date range or a single date for your whole family. It's that simple. This will save everyone a great deal of time and effort.

TIP #3: Something comes up after the schedule is generated and you find that you are unavailable? Simple, just click the **REQUEST SUB** button on your email reminder or from the website or app. An email will automatically be sent to all volunteers in the ministry who are qualified and available. The first person to accept the position is added to the schedule. Changes to the schedule are updated in real time and therefore the schedule is always accurate. If something comes up within 24 hours of your scheduled time, it is your responsibility to find a sub **and** call or text your ministry leader to let him/ her know who will be coming in your place. At this point, it is too late to go through the online scheduler system. It is not acceptable to text your ministry leader on Saturday and say something came up and I can't serve tomorrow. To find a list of the other volunteers in your ministry, log on to the website and click on the appropriate ministry roster.

TIP #4: If you don't already have **the app** for your phone, get it! It is available for android and apple. Search "Ministry Scheduler Pro" on either the App Store or Google Play. Look for the Green M Icon. Once you install the app, you will need the ORGANIZATION ID: stjamesfairhope.

Tip #5: If you have **Forgotten your username or password,** call the office at (251) 928-2912 or email Jennifer at communications@stjamesfairhope.org or Elizabeth at info@stjamesfairhope.org, and we can reset it for you.

Tip #6: Easily find the **Ministry Scheduler Pro website** by going to the home page of the St.

James website at stjamesfairhope.org or click the button at the bottom of one of the Anchor Lines

Update emails sent on Friday. Need help with the website? Online readers can click here for *This short video* which demonstrates how to use the Web

Terminal. The video can also be accessed once you are logged in by clicking on the Help tab at anytime. If you need additional help, call the office and schedule a time to meet with Jennifer. She will be happy to show you how to use the website or app.

Tip #7: Readers, did you know that the readings are available online and on the app? For the app, click on the date of the service, then click "Resources." For the website, click on "Full Schedules," the time of the service, then the resource will be available on the right hand side of the screen. This is especially helpful to those who sub for someone at the last minute, after the office closes.

New to St. James?

When you join a new church, there is so much to learn, so many new faces, so many new ministries. Where do you go? What do you do? Where do you find the information you need? Where is the restroom? All of this newness can be frustrating and sometimes cause anxiety. We want to help. If you have any questions, feel free to call any of the staff at the parish office at (251) 928-2912.

NEWCOMER CARDS: Have you filled out a newcomer card, or let the church office know that you have started attending services at St. James? If so, thank you for letting us know you are here. If not, please reach out! If you would like to transfer your letter to St. James or become an Episcopalian, or just need a name tag for now, contact Meghan Fancher, our Parish Administrator at (251) 928-2912 and she will handle the details.

OFFICE HOURS: The Parish office is open from 8:30 am until 5 pm, Monday through Thursday. If you have a pastoral emergency and need to reach the on-call priest during non-office hours, call (251) 928-2912 and listen to the prompts. One of our priests will return your call.


